



Everyday La Pointe Art Junket Tour

Round trip from Point 1 to Point 13 is 1.34 miles, so take time to stop for snacks, ice cream, cool drinks or a meal!

- 1 Stone Water Fountain:** Gazebo's foundation is Island stone. Work done by local masons, Hart Bros., later fortified by Tim Sullivan and Barb Brown.
- 2 Ella's Driftwood:** Lake Superior driftwood artfully arranged by Linda Geier.

Go back down Main Street and left on Colonel Woods Avenue. Pass the Museum. Left on Whitefish St., then an immediate right onto Lot W (parking) Head towards the white spire midst pine trees. The white Greek revival ("Geek" in library humor) building is the Madeline Island Library.

- 3 Library Stepping Stones~Pat Gary DeBary Memorial Garden** was started by Jeff Theune and the Apostle Islands Academy/Alternative Education Bayfield School District. Stones and tree signage are in honor of loved ones. **The Library** features an art collection and books by Madeline Island writers. (Hours vary)

Meander back onto Parking Lot W and back onto Colonel Woods Avenue. Head towards the lake

- 4 Tiny Town~Mini Golf:** Island structures in miniature.
- 5 Wheeler Walkway:** The art of gardening junque with readily available material such as culverts made into planters (courtesy of Evan Erickson).
- 6 Stone Masonry Benches** by Tim Sullivan and Barb Brown, using stones from the Island and Lake Superior.
- 7 Metal Mermaid:** Bell Street Gallery.
- 8 Tom Burned Down Café:** Metal art, signs, junque, and other artfully arranged stuff.
Cross pedestrian walk over Middle Road onto Parking Lot R.
- 9 Art of Skateboarding:** Island teens collected donations and wrote grants to make a dream come true.
- 10 Art Guild & Gallery:** Scheduled exhibits.
Continue on Middle Road towards the lake. Go left on Main Street. Continue on Main Street past Café Seiche on the corner.
- 11 Metal Mobile Garden** You have walked .6 mile or 12 minutes.
- 12 Woods Hall:** art, weaving – artist's co-op.
- 13 Island Carvers:** wood art and "fairy village" by a "year 'round" couple.



Historic Downtown Walking Tour

Round trip from Point 1 to 9 is .6 miles.

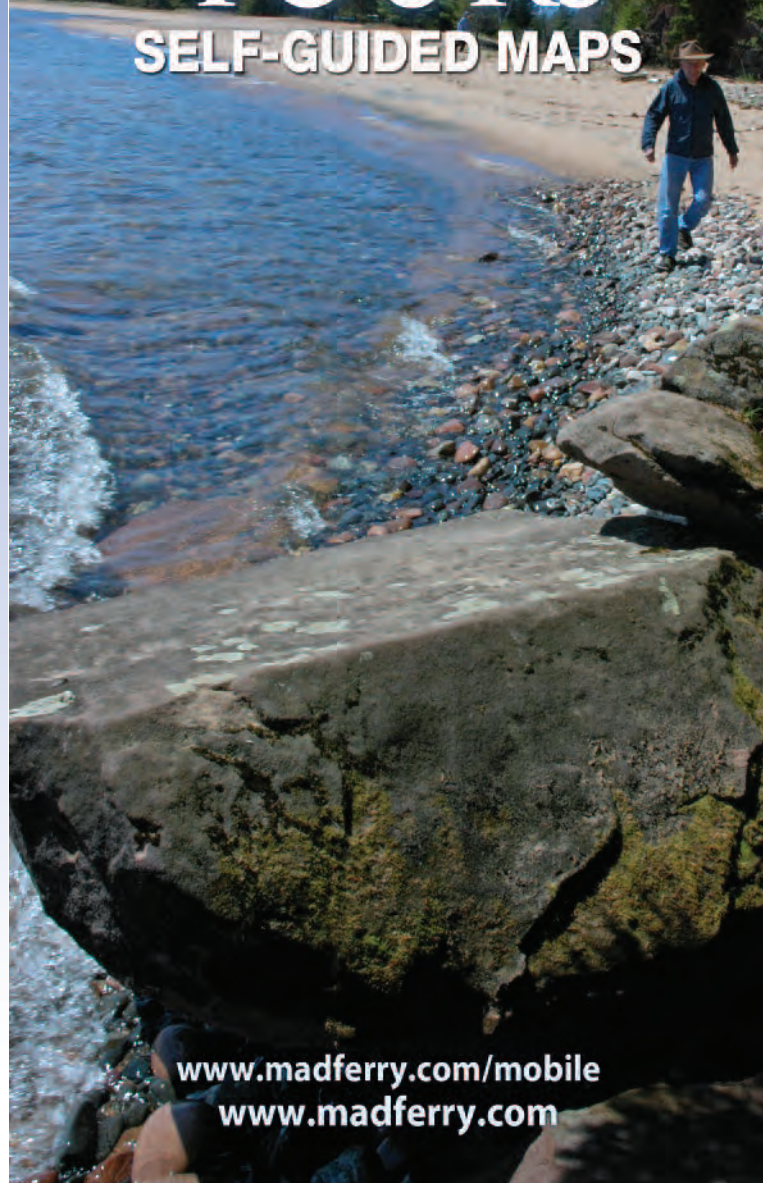
- 1 U.S. Post Office** was part of the Old Mission Inn dining room addition, built in 1900, and later moved to this site.
- 2 Waterfront Gallery**, a simply-designed (circa 1900) commercial building was once an island grocery store.
- 3 The 4-ton Propeller** was salvaged from the tug *Ashland*, a working vessel used to tow log rafts on western Lake Superior in the early 1900s.
- 4 Madeline Island Museum:** Explore the Island's rich history at Madeline Island Museum. Established in 1958.
- 5 La Pointe School** is a quintessential two-room school house. In 2011, twelve elementary-age children attended.
- 6 Town Hall:** Designed in 1909 by Iron River Concrete Building Co. in a neo-classical style. This is the only Island government building. Town meetings have been held here since 1860.
- 7 St. Joseph Catholic Church** was built in 1901, to replace an earlier log structure destroyed by fire. Father Frederic Baraga established the first Catholic mission on the island in 1835, near the present-day marina.
- 8 Madeline Island Library:** Built as Bay View School in 1872-1873. Greek Revival style. Was moved to present location in 1903. A front porch, two-story back addition, handicap accessible entrance, etc. were added.
- 9 Lakeview School:** Built in 1905 by locals, Olaf Dahlin and Victor Hultquist, and moved here in 1987.
